Key Takeaways

Voters believe data centers should be built with American materials but worry AI could negatively affect manufacturing employment.

- 73% of voters says data center projects should maximize job growth by using American-made materials, while 69% are concerned that artificial intelligence could negatively impact manufacturing jobs.

METHODOLOGY

This poll was conducted between December 16-December 18, 2025, among a sample of 1,800 Registered Voters. The interviews were conducted online, and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Registered Voters based on gender by age, educational attainment, race, and region.

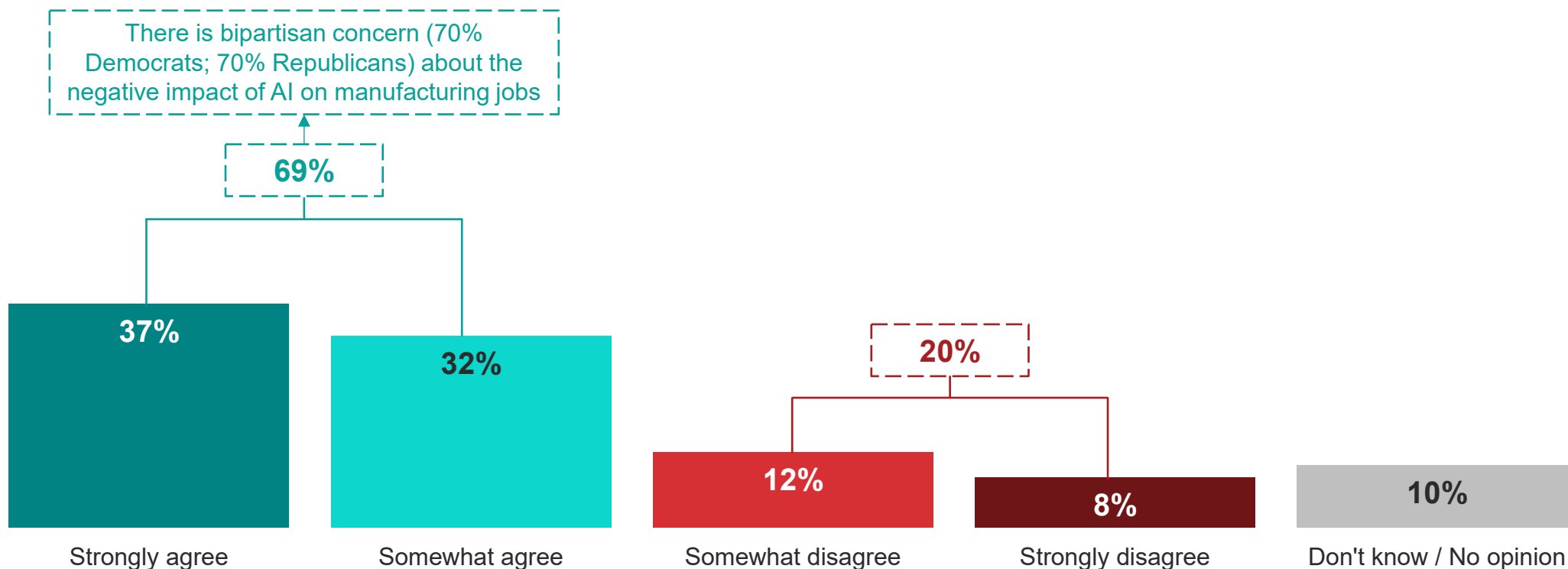
Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.

I'm concerned that AI could negatively impact manufacturing jobs.

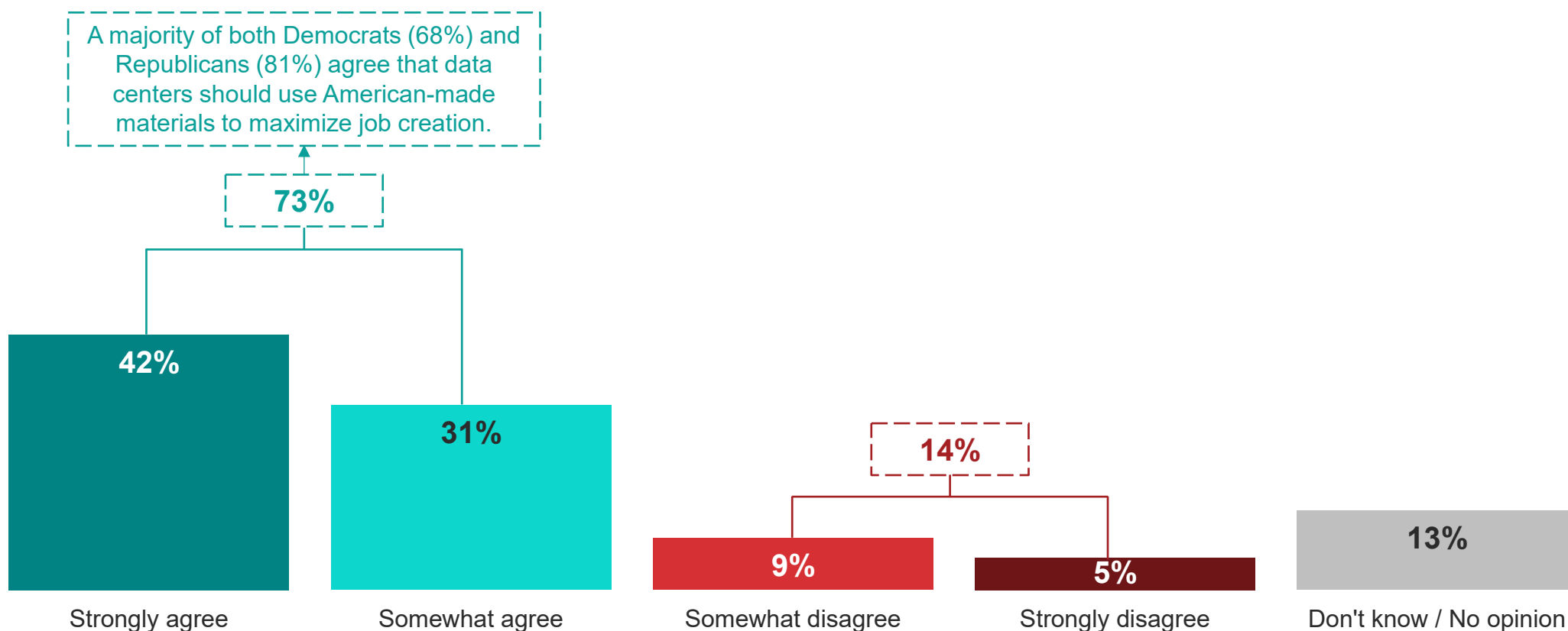


DATA CENTERS & AI
